DAYS 1-3. CRUISING THE INSIDE PASSAGE.

JUNEAU PORT OF CALL. Board your cruise ship in Vancouver, B.C. and prepare for an unforgettable adventure. Cruise the beautiful Inside Passage to Juneau, Alaska's capital. Here, enjoy optional shore excursions like the Mendenhall Glacier Float Trip, Historic Gold Panning Adventure & Salmon Bake, Glacier View Sea Kayaking, Historic Gold Mining & Panning Adventure, Mendenhall Lake Canoe Adventure, Whale Watching & Salmon Bake, Best of Juneau® and the Gold Creek Salmon Bake.

DAY 4. SKAGWAY. We'll meet you dockside in Skagway and take care of your luggage. You'll have time to explore this historic town and stroll its boardwalks before having a scrumptious lunch and rollicking good time on fun and **FREE shore excursion Liarsville Gold Rush Trail Camp & Salmon Bake tour.** Upon your return to town, pick up your motorhome at the Skagway Mountain View RV Park and receive a thorough orientation. You'll still have plenty of Alaskan daylight left to stroll down Broadway and try out Skagway's shops and saloons before overnighting in the RV Park. We're handy if you have last-minute questions about your motorhome.

DAY 5. SKAGWAY-WHITEHORSE. Today you can seek out more adventures in Skagway, including the optional *Yukon Jeep® Klondike Highway Adventure*, or just sleep late before beginning your motorhome tour with a drive up the scenic Klondike Highway to Whitehorse. You'll have an overview of the arduous White Pass Trail, used by stampedeers of the Klondike Gold Rush. In Whitehorse you overnight at your reserved campsite.

DAY 6. WHITEHORSE-BEAVER CREEK. Drive along blue, glacier-fed Kluane Lake, with the snowy peaks of the Kluane Ranges to the west. Take time for fishing, gold panning, hiking. Then arrive at Beaver Creek on the Yukon-Alaska border via the Alaska Highway.

DAY 7. BEAVER CREEK-FAIRBANKS. Watch for the TransAlaska Pipeline as you continue on the Alaska Highway to Fairbanks. Summertime daylight lasts far into the night; in late summer you might see the Aurora Borealis.

DAY 8. FAIRBANKS-DENALI. While in Fairbanks, consider an optional riverboat cruise on the Discovery, a genuine sternwheeler, try gold panning at Gold Dredge #8, or visit the excellent museum at the University of Alaska. Then it's a short drive south to Denali area campground, where you'll spend two nights. If you haven't already reserved a spot on an excursion into the Park, you can sign up at the campground office.

DAY 9. DENALI NATIONAL PARK. Now for Denali National Park, home of North America's tallest mountain: 20,320-ft. McKinley. To see the most of this vast wildlife preserve, consider an optional Denali Jeep® Backcountry Safari tour. Perhaps a flightseeing tour with a local naturalist to help you spot Dall sheep, moose and caribou in the peaks and valleys below.

DAY 10. DENALI-ANCHORAGE. Drive south on the Parks Highway, with mountain views to amaze you and friendly small towns along the way, such as Talkeetna—headquarters for McKinley climbers. In Anchorage take in some city sights, or a great seafood dinner. Overnight.

DAY 11. ANCHORAGE. Free day in Anchorage. Recommended optional tours include the 26 Glacier Cruise, Kenai Fjords National Park tour and Prince William Sound cruise. Overnight in Anchorage Ship Creek RV Park.

DAY 12. ANCHORAGE, TOUR'S END. This morning, drop off your RV, and we transfer you to the airport for your flight home, or on to your next adventure!

Itinerary

DAY 1. ANCHORAGE-DENALI.

We'll pick you up at the airport or a local hotel. After your orientation, strike out along the scenic Glenn and Parks Highways toward Denali National Park—six million acres of mountains, tundra, forests and rivers, and home of Mt. McKinley, North America's tallest mountain.

DAY 2. DENALI NATIONAL PARK.

Your free day to explore the Park. Consider the optional Denali Jeep® Backcountry Safari tour with an experienced guide to help you spot the native creatures, or a scenic wilderness tour that takes you deep into the park. These and other optional local tours may be reserved ahead. Don't miss your opportunity to see Denali up close and personal.

DAY 3. DENALI-FAIRBANKS.

Drive north to Fairbanks, the state's second-largest city. There's lots to see: the University of Alaska-Fairbanks and its fine museum and demonstration gardens; the TransAlaska Pipeline just out of town; the huge retired Gold Dredge #8, where you can try your luck at gold panning; an optional cruise on the sternwheeler Discovery.

DAY 4. FAIRBANKS-BEAVER CREEK.

Head out on the Alaska Highway to Beaver Creek, near the Yukon-Alaska border. Enjoy the scenery. Watch for wildlife along the road.

DAY 5. BEAVER CREEK-WHITEHORSE.

Drive the Alaska Highway along beautiful Kluane Lake, Yukon's largest lake. Take a side trip into Kluane National Park, photograph snowclad peaks and glacial streams. In Whitehorse you might tour the S.S. Klondike, a retired sternwheeler. At the sod-roofed log-walled McBride Museum discover a trove of riverboat history, the stagecoach era and the Gold Rush.

DAY 6. WHITEHORSE-SKAGWAY.

In Skagway, at the foot of White Pass, you're at the exact spot where thousands of fortune-seekers came ashore from their crowded ships, in a fever to search for gold. Tour the town and visit their haunts. Overnight at Skagway Mountain View RV Park, a short walk from the downtown historic district.

DAY 7. SKAGWAY, SAIL.

Before embarking on your cruise you might enjoy a fun **FREE shore excursion Liarsville Gold Rush Trail Camp & Salmon Bake tour**. Afterward board your Holland America Line ship, and set sail for Vancouver, B.C.

DAYS 8-11. GLACIER BAY, KETCHIKAN PORT OF CALL, AND CRUISING THE INSIDE PASSAGE.

Cruising Glacier Bay, Ketchikan and the Inside Passage to Vancouver, B.C. Tour's end. DAYS 1-7. GLACIER DISCOVERY CRUISE, CRUISE THE INSIDE PASSAGE. Board your ship in Vancouver, B.C. Your cruise includes port of calls at Ketchikan, Juneau, and Skagway, plus cruising Glacier Bay National Park and the Gulf of Alaska. Be sure and check out the variety of shore excursion options that are available to enhance your trip.

DAY 8. SEWARD-ANCHORAGE. After you disembark in Seward, board your comfortable motorcoach or van for a scenic trip to Anchorage, where you pick up your RV. We give you a thorough orientation on your vehicle, then overnight at Anchorage Ship Creek RV Park. You'll have time left to sightsee and stock up on groceries, or have dinner out.

DAY 9. ANCHORAGE-DENALI. Drive the Glenn and Parks Highways to Denali, with mountain ranges to right and left. Watch for a glimpse of the Great One—McKinley—if weather permits. Overnight near the entrance to Denali National Park.

DAY 10. DENALI NATIONAL PARK. Your day to explore the Park. To see the most of this vast area, sign up for an optional Denali Jeep® Backcountry Safari tour.

DAY 11. DENALI-FAIRBANKS. Rejoin the scenic Parks Highway, and drive north to Fairbanks, Alaska's second largest city. Keep your camera handy, as wildlife sightings are not uncommon along the road. Fairbanks is closer to the Land of the Midnight Sun, so you'll have plenty of daylight after you arrive at your campsite.

DAY 12. FAIRBANKS. There's no lack of things to do here. Consider a visit to the University of Alaska-Fairbanks, with its excellent museum. Inspect a retired gold dredge, or view the TransAlaska Pipeline up close.

DAY 13. FAIRBANKS-GLENNALLEN. You start your day driving on the famous Alaska Highway. At Delta Junction, branch off southward on the Richardson Highway. You'll have many sightings of the TransAlaska Pipeline and gorgeous views of the Wrangell Mountains in Wrangell-St. Elias National Park. Overnight near Glennallen.

DAY 14. GLENNALLEN-ANCHORAGE. Glennallen is the gateway to Alaska's Copper River region, famous for its wild salmon runs. As you drive southwest on the Glenn Highway, you'll enjoy more magnificent mountain views. Overnight at your reserved campsite at Anchorage Ship Creek RV Park.

DAY 15. ANCHORAGE, TOUR'S END. This morning bid your trusty vehicle au revoir, then we transfer you to the airport for your flight home.

DAYS 1-7. GLACIER DISCOVERY CRUISE, INSIDE PASSAGE. Board your cruise ship in Vancouver, B.C. Your cruise includes calls at Ketchikan, Juneau, and Skagway, plus cruising Glacier Bay National Park and the Gulf of Alaska. Don't forget to look at the wide variety of shore excursion options that are available in each port to enhance your trip.

DAY 8. SEWARD-ANCHORAGE. This morning, arrive in Seward and board a comfortable motorcoach or van for your excursion to Anchorage and a thorough orientation on your RV. Overnight at Anchorage Ship Creek RV Park.

DAY 9. ANCHORAGE. Spend the day exploring Anchorage, Alaska's largest city. Learn about Alaska's heritage and culture at the Museum of History and Art, or go for a drive along Turnagain Arm. If conditions permit, you may witness the tidal bore—a wall of water rushing up the inlet. Overnight at Anchorage Ship Creek RV Park.

DAY 10. ANCHORAGE-DENALI. Drive the Glenn and Parks Highways to Denali, with mountain ranges to right and left. Overnight near the entrance to Denali National Park.

DAY 11. DENALI NATIONAL PARK. There are many optional tours at the Park to choose from, sign up for the optional Denali Jeep® Backcountry Safari tour or a 13-hour scenic wilderness tour. Watch for the abundant wild creatures and, weather permitting, that most elusive wild wonder of all, Mt. McKinley.

DAY 12. DENALI-FAIRBANKS. On the road again, head for Fairbanks, where the sun hardly sets at all in summertime. In late summer you might see the aurora borealis. You may want to visit the University of Alaska-Fairbanks, with its excellent museum and demonstration gardens, or inspect a retired gold dredge and try goldpanning.

DAY 13. FAIRBANKS-BEAVER CREEK. Head out on the Alaska Highway to Beaver Creek, near the Yukon-Alaska border. Enjoy the scenery. Watch for wildlife along the road, and the TransAlaska Pipeline, snaking its way over hills and valleys.

DAY 14. BEAVER CREEK-WHITEHORSE. Drive the Alaska Highway along beautiful Kluane Lake, Yukon's largest lake. In Whitehorse you might tour the S.S. Klondike, a retired sternwheeler. At the sod-roofed McBride Museum, discover a trove of Gold Rush history.

DAY 15. WHITEHORSE. Free day to explore Whitehorse. Overnight.

DAY 16. WHITEHORSE-WATSON LAKE. On the way to Watson Lake, make sure to see the Sign Forest, a thicket of more than 10,000 highway signs—still growing. Overnight at Watson Lake, gateway to the Yukon.

Alaska

Anchorage is Alaska's largest city, but you still sense the proximity of the wilderness and the frontier spirit. Among the sights: the world's largest seaplane base, and the Museum of History and Art. Witness the tidal bore along Turnagain Arm (conditions permitting), when a wall of water up to six feet high rushes up the inlet. Catch a comfortable night's rest at Anchorage Ship Creek RV Park.

Homer, on the Kenai Peninsula,

attracts fishermen, artists and seekers of spectacular scenery. Across the bay a timbered coastline rises to the glacier-capped peaks of the Kenai Mountains. Visit Homer Spit, abustle with fisherfolk, a small-boat harbor, canneries, boat building shops and the occasional artist with an easel.

Denali National Park and Preserve

is home to North America's tallest mountain, and to wildlife in amazing abundance. Weather permitting, you may catch a glimpse of 20,320-ft. Mt. McKinley long before you reach the park, from the highway between Anchorage and Fairbanks. To fully enjoy your time in the area, sign up for an optional tour, like the Denali Jeep® Backcountry Safari.

Fairbanks began as a Gold Rush town and has been thriving ever since. Here you may inspect the TransAlaska Pipeline, just outside of town. Pay a visit to Gold Dredge #8, and try your hand at panning.

Skagway was one of the liveliest towns in the hemisphere in 1898, when it was the gateway to Gold Rush Country. And it hasn't lost a particle of its spirit. Here you'll overnight at Skagway Mountain View RV Park.

Located just a short walk from your campground, the whole down-town is a National Historic Park, with its well-trodden boardwalks and false-fronted saloons. Shopping is fun here, for anything from gold nugget jewelry to original works of Alaskan art. For a rollicking good time take in the Liarville Gold Rush Trail Camp & Salmon Bake (provided complimentary on Tours 1 and 2).

The Alaska Highway

This historic road began as a one-lane supply line to Alaska at the outbreak of World War II. Today it runs from Dawson Creek, BC, for 1,520 miles to Fairbanks. Along the way you might spot moose, caribou, bison and Dall sheep.

Kluane National Park and Preserve,

between Whitehorse and Beaver Creek, is an UNESCO World Heritage Site. It contains some of Canada's highest peaks and is a prime wildlife-viewing area. The Alaska Highway skirts crystal-clear, glacier-fed Kluane Lake for 40 miles while the snow clad, 7,000-ft.-plus Kluane Ranges parallel the highway to the west. Take side trips into the park for trout

fishing, gold panning, walking the tundra and marveling at colorful wildflowers. The scenery is incredible. You may glimpse distant giants of the St. Elias Mountain Range.

The Yukon

Whitehorse, capital of Yukon Territory, is a friendly modern city that provides vivid reminders of its Gold Rush beginnings. Here, on the banks of the Yukon River, the prospectors who struggled up from Skagway had their first chance to dry out after running the treacherous rapids of the Yukon River. You may visit the grand old sternwheeler, S.S. Klondike, permanently anchored on dry land by the riverside. Take the whole family for an evening of hilarious history at the Frantic Follies Vaudeville Revue.

Dawson City is a perfectly preserved Gold Rush town. Hardly anything has changed since the boom days when thousands descended on the town to get rich quick.

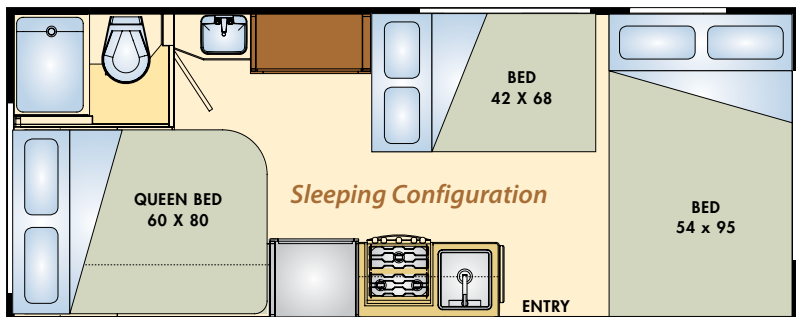
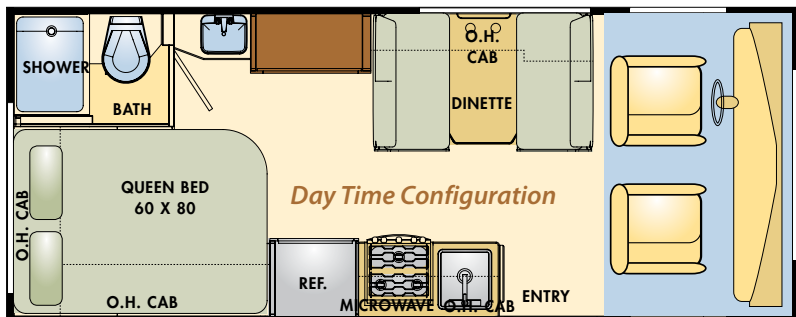
Large RV

ATA acts as agent for the various transportation companies, excursion contractors, and campground operators and is in no way to be considered the principal or operator of all the services. ATA reserves the right to cancel or alter any itinerary as conditions may require. ATA, tour operators and/or travel agencies booking these vacation packages will not be responsible for expenses due to delays or cancellation of transportation, facilities or services employed in these vacation packages or any increase in transportation rates effective after publication of this brochure. Guests in the care of Holland America Line shall be governed by the cruise contract that will accompany their documentation.

Reservations. When making reservations through a travel agent your deposits and final payments for ATA services will be paid to that travel agent. Travel documents shall be issued after final payment has been received by ATA. Refunds will be made to the travel agency less any applicable fees, deposits and charges. Guests are responsible for obtaining from their travel agency monies retained or received by the agency.

Deposits and Final Payment. A deposit of \$400 per person is required within 10 days to retain a reservation. Final payment is due 90 days prior to the scheduled tour departure. For bookings within 90 days, final payment is due within 10 days. All payments shall be made in U.S. funds by VISA, MasterCard, Discover Card, American Express, check or money order made payable and mailed to:

Included In the Tour Price:

- A shared category K cruise stateroom for 3, 4 or 7 nights depending upon tour.
- Use of a Class C motorhome for the land portion of the tour, including "Housekeeping Package" and mileage charges.
- Reserved private campsites for duration of land tour.
- Transfers, on RV departure/arrival days, between the airport and the RV depot in Anchorage and/or Seattle, and/or between the cruise ship terminal and the RV depot in Skagway.
- Motorcoach or van transfer between Anchorage and Seward on tours 3, 4 and 5.
- Baggage storage during RV use on Tours 3 and 5 (one piece of luggage per person).
- RV land tour orientation briefing.

- Toll-free Roadside Assistance line.
- Comprehensive day-by-day itinerary, including maps and directions.

Not Included In the Tour Price:

- Air transportation (optional home city air may be purchased for an additional charge).
- Beverages and purchases aboard ship.
- Tips for drivers, airport skycaps or shipboard personnel.
- Meals during the land portion of the tour.
- Gasoline and propane for the RV.
- Attractions, parking or entrance fees, permits, bridge, highway or ferry tolls, unless otherwise stated.
- Transfers between either Vancouver or Seattle-Tacoma International Airports and Vancouver, B.C. cruise ship terminal. These transfers may be arranged at an additional cost.

Upgrades and Substitutions. ATA reserves the right to upgrade a guest to superior cruise and/or RV accommodations at no additional cost. Should lesser accommodations or equipment be offered and accepted, ATA's liability to the customer shall be limited to a refund of the price differential.

Guests with Disabilities. Motorhomes are not equipped for disabled access. However, Holland America Line ships have a limited number of staterooms designed to be wheelchair accessible.

Immigration. All tour participants must carry a valid passport. Citizens/residents of other countries should consult their local American and Canadian embassies, consular offices, or immigration offices for any additional entry and exit requirements.

Cancellation Policy. A full refund, less Cancellation Fees Protection (CFP) coverage if purchased at time of deposit, will be made for cancellations received in writing on or before 91 days prior to commencement of the tour departure date. Cancellations for any reason within 90 days of the scheduled departure date are subject to the following cancellation fees:

- 90 to 61 days prior to scheduled departure date: \$400 per person.
- 60 to 46 days prior to scheduled departure date: 25% of total cost per person.
- 45 to 31 days prior to scheduled departure date: 50% of total cost per person.
- 30 to 16 days prior to scheduled departure date: 75% of total cost per person.
- 15 days up to and including departure date: 100% of total cost per person.

Cancellation Fees Protection (CFP). CFP allows cancellation of reservations up to 72 hours prior to 12:01 am of the scheduled departure date without incurring cancellation fees in excess of deposits. Cancellations must be received in writing. Deposits are forfeited if cancellation

occurs 90 or fewer days prior to tour departure date, whether or not optional CFP is purchased. Cost for CFP is 5% of the total purchase price of the tour including all options, port charges, taxes and fees. CFP is optional, non-refundable, and shall be submitted with deposit. CFP is not insurance. It provides no rights other than those explained above. It does not protect 3rd/4th shared guest rates if one or more members of a party cancel. Nor does it cover expenses or unused services due to trip interruption.

Assistance Change Charges. A minimum service charge of \$75 per person will be assessed for all changes to travel arrangements after final payment is received. Change charges will not apply to stateroom upgrade supplements or additional services unless air reservations are altered and/or if travel documents must be reissued. Name changes and departure date changes are considered reservation cancellations and are subject to the cancellation policy.

Custom Itineraries. ATA will entertain requests for custom itineraries. There is an additional charge for this service. Charges generally range from \$100 to \$200 per booking, but may be higher depending upon the itinerary complexity and service demands associated with the custom itinerary. Requests should be forwarded in writing and a price quote will be provided for the itinerary requested.

Late Booking Policy. Bookings requested within 90 days of departure will be accepted subject to full payment. If a late booking request is confirmed, and subsequently canceled, guests shall be subject to standard cancellation policies.

Cruise Ship Accommodations. Per person, double occupancy and 3rd/4th own stateroom rates are based upon category K inside two lower berths and are subject to availability. Upgrades may be required at an additional cost. Third and fourth guests sharing a stateroom generally require a category upgrade for the first two guests.

Recreational Vehicles. Recreational vehicles provided by ATA are late-model, fully equipped and self-contained. The size utilized will be determined by the size of the party and availability. Parties of 2, 3 and 4 will generally be accommodated in units of 21 to 24 feet in length. Parties of 5 or 6 will generally be accommodated in units of 28 to 31 feet. ATA reserves the right to assign units at its sole discretion. Requests for vehicle upgrades are subject to availability and will require an additional charge of \$250 per week or fraction thereof.

RV Pick Up and Drop Off Times. Motorhomes will be available for pick up between 2:00 pm and 5:00 pm on the day the RV land tour

commences. Vehicles will be vacated between 7:00 am and 9:00 am depending upon transfer times. Vehicles may be obtained at times other than stated, subject to availability. Additional fees shall apply.

Late Drop Off Charges and Other Fees. The RV you drop off will be picked up the same day by other ATA guests. In between, the vehicle requires servicing, re-provisioning and cleaning. As you will appreciate the timely return of the RV by guests who precede you, we appreciate your consideration for the guests that follow. We reserve the right to impose late drop off fees of \$50 per hour, or fraction thereof, for RV's that are returned or vacated after the specified time. Transfers are available on days of RV pick up and drop off during the hours of 7:00 am and 5:00 pm. Guests purchasing home city air may be accommodated outside of those hours due to airline schedules. Other transfers may be available at an additional charge. Fees shall also be imposed for vehicles returned with less than full gasoline and propane tanks, unclean interiors, smoking in vehicles and for holding tanks that have not been dumped. Details of these fees are contained in the Rental Agreement.

Campground Accommodations. A private campsite is reserved each night of the land portion of your tour. Efforts have been made to accommodate you in the best and most conveniently located campground at each overnight location. Water and electric hookups are requested when and where possible.

Unused Services. Refunds are not available for unused prepaid excursions or transfers when voluntarily canceled. Requests for valid refunds must be made in writing through your travel agent or to ATA explaining the circumstances of the refund request, applicable dates, and the confirmation number.

Recreational Vehicle Insurance. ATA provides comprehensive collision and liability insurance for its RVs. The cost for this mandatory insurance coverage is \$75 per driver for tours 1-3; \$85 for tours 4 and 5; and \$95 for tour 4-E. This insurance, less a \$500 deductible, will cover incidents involving your RV in much the same manner as your own automobile policy. Luggage Handling and Storage. ATA will store one piece of cruise luggage per person at no charge for Tours 3 and 5. Additional pieces are charged at a rate of \$25 per piece.

RV Driver Qualifications. Guests designated as RV drivers must be a minimum of 25 years of age and have a valid driver's license. Drivers must complete and sign a Guest Registration and Rental Agreement at time of pick up.

Non-Smoking Policy. ATA maintains a no smoking policy in its motorhomes.

RV Damage Deposit. An RV damage deposit equal to the \$500 insurance deductible is required at the time the RV is picked up. Deposit will be charged to a qualifying credit card. Deposits will be fully refundable upon return of the RV in satisfactory condition. Any vehicle damage will be deducted from the deposit up to the \$500 deductible limit. Specific acts of negligence, as outlined in the Rental Agreement, may increase driver liability for vehicle damage.

RV Road Restrictions. There are various roads in Alaska, Yukon, and British Columbia that are deemed by ATA to be unsuitable for RV travel. These roads will be noted in the Rental Agreement, and unauthorized travel is not covered by your ATA insurance policy.

Increases in Fares, Port charges or Taxes. Fares quoted in this brochure are those in effect at the time of printing. If cost factors, including, but not limited to, airline and/or cruise costs, dictate the need for fare increases, ATA may do so at any time prior to tour departure date. ATA reserves the right to pass along any increases in taxes, fees or port charges imposed by a government agency, airline or cruise line.

Documentation. A document package, including all applicable tour and air documents, maps, luggage tags and complete itinerary, will be sent to the guest or booking agent 30 to 15 days prior to the tour departure date. Cruise documents will be available for downloading and printing on the Internet.

Airline Schedule Changes. Airlines may revise their schedules at any time for any reason. If this occurs, ATA reserves the right to adjust guests' itineraries and air carriers accordingly. We may require that travel documents be returned to your travel agent, or directly to us, for proper adjustments.

Flight Itinerary Advice. In an effort to minimize inconvenience to guests that may be caused by airline scheduling changes, notification of air itineraries may not be possible earlier than 35 days prior to departure. We recommend that guests telephone their airline prior to travel to reconfirm their reservations and to reserve specific seats.

Air Refunds. Air is non-refundable once tickets have been issued.

Airport Transfers. On RV departure/arrival days guests arriving or departing Anchorage or Seattle by air will be provided a transfer between the airport or airport area hotels and the RV depot.

Personal Air Arrangements. Guests who make their own air arrangements must be aware of the following conditions:

- Flights arriving prior to departure day in Anchorage or Seattle will not be entitled to transfers.
- ATA must be notified of arrival and departure flight schedules in order to provide transfers. This information must be received at least 14 days prior to tour departure date.

Seattle-Vancouver Motorcoach. For guests arriving by air in Seattle and commencing their tour by ship in Vancouver special motorcoach service between Seattle and Vancouver is available for \$65 per person, one way. This service is available in each direction on days of cruise ship arrival and departure. Advance reservations are required. A snack is included.

- Northbound. Motorcoaches depart from Seattle-Tacoma International Airport between 10:30 am and 11:30 am. Check in no later than 11:00 am.
- Southbound. Motorcoaches leave the pier in Vancouver between 8:30 am and 9:30 am and take you directly to the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport.

Vancouver Cruise Ship Terminal Transfers. If you are making your own air arrangements into or out of Vancouver, at the beginning or end of your cruise, transfers can be arranged between the cruise ship terminal and Vancouver airport on days of cruise arrival/departure for an additional \$24 per person.

Special Requests. ATA will make every effort to accommodate special requests for specific airlines, flights, connections, routings and classes of service. Additional rates and service fees shall apply. You may contact your airline directly once you receive your documents to request seat assignments, special meals, special assistance, or other services they may provide.
